

The CBD Programme of Work on Forest Biodiversity

- Adopted in 2002, confirmed in 2009 (decision IX/5) with new priorities: unregulated and unsustainable use of forest products (including illegal logging), bushmeat harvesting, climate change, desertification, illegal land conversion, habitat fragmentation, environmental degradation, forest fires, and invasive alien species
- 130 Actions, grouped in 12 goals and 3 thematic elements:
- 1. Conservation, Sustainable Use, and Benefit Sharing
- 2. Institutional, Socio-Economic Enabling Environment
- 3. Knowledge, Assessment, and Monitoring







Activities of SCBD

- Regional and/or thematic workshops to support POW, in collaboration with CPF
- Enhance coordination with CPF
- Support Parties efforts on REDD, with UNFCCC, World Bank, and CPF
- Workplan/targeted joint activities with UNFF
- Information on forest resistance/resilience and biodiversity
- Information on linkages Ramsar and CBD guidance
- Refine forest classifications with FAO





Links between CBD and UNFF/CPF

- Enhance coordination and awareness raising: through meetings and events at all FAO Regional Forestry Commission meetings; events at World Forest Week; World Forestry Congress; UNFF-8, UNFCCC meetings; CPF meetings; bilateral collaboration with CPF members
- Collaboration with UNFF: staff exchange (2008); joint events at UNFF-8; joint workshop 2009; draft MoU (pending signature); joint position in New York (funding dependent); collaboration on IYB and IYF
- Joint celebration of closing IYB and launching IYF in Japan, December 2010 (tentative)





International Forest Policy

- United Nations Forum on Forests (UNFF): 2007 non-legally binding instrument and multi-year programme of work
- Collaborative Partnership on Forests (CPF): Ready to support capacity building on ABS after COP-10







International Forest Policy

- FAO: National Forest Programme Facility (NFP), and national level support programme including NTFPs
- **FAO:** State of the World Forest Genetic Resources Report by 2013, in collaboration with SCBD and other international institutions: IRC (Bioversity, ICRAF ...), IUFRO, Regional networks on FGR, etc.
- National level: Some information about genetic resources available, even in absence of national ABS, e.g. in FRA 2010 (reporting table on NTFP; forest species), and national forest inventories – basic structure for national competent authorities?








Activities of SCBD 2008 - 2010
