



What we achieved since 2011

- Strong commitment to achieve Aichi Targets (271 commitments from 202 organizations in Niju-maru Project).
- Raising public awareness for Biodiversity through outreach programme.

Future challenges for 2015 - 2020

- Enhancing collaboration between NGOs, local governments and business sectors.
- Wider commitment for Aichi Targets, especially less committed targets (ex. T.16).
- Higher public awareness for Biodiversity,
 Aichi Targets and UNDB.
