






Aloha+ Challenge: A Culture of Sustainability -- He Nohona 'Ae 'Oia

This sustainability dashboard will keep track of Hawaii's progress on the Aloha+ Challenge. The Aloha+ Challenge is a shared, statewide commitment by Hawaii's Governor, Office of Hawaiian Affairs and four Mayors to 2030 targets for (1) clean energy, (2) local food production, (3) natural resource management, (4) waste reduction, (5) smart growth and climate resilience, and (6) green job creation and education. The Aloha+ Challenge has also been endorsed by the Legislature through Resolution (SCR69 http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/session2014/bills/SCR69_SD1_.pdf). The dashboard includes state and county level sustainability indicators with additional information and links for how to get involved in building a more sustainability indicators.




