

STEPPES AND DESERTS OF EURASIA: A REFUGE FOR MIGRATORY SPECIES

Steppes and deserts have been neglected by conservation efforts, compared to other ecosystems. Remaining largely unfragmented and providing a refuge for many migratory species, aridlands warrant closer attention despite their low species density. UNEP/CMS and a panel of experts will highlight the threats faced by Saiga antelope and other mammals, Siberian Cranes, waterbirds and raptors, as well as outline current activities and avenues for future conservation.
