2. OFFICIAL OPENING

The Regional Workshop for Southern Africa on Updating National Biodiversity Strategies and Action Plans: Incorporating work on valuation and incentive measures will be officially opened on **Sunday**, 13 March 2011 at 15:30. The workshop sessions will be held daily from 8:30 to 12.30 and from 13:30 to 17:00.

3. **REGISTRATION**

Registration will be on the day of arrival (Sunday, 13 March) at the venue of the workshop. Participants will be presented with the workshop package and name tags. Registration hours:

5. ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation will be provided in the Cresta Mowana Safari Lodge, which is also the venue for the workshop.

Kindly refer to the KCS block booking to benefit from the special rate of 1023 Pula (Approximately US \$150.00) which includes breakfast.

4.1 Meals

Morning Tea, Lunch and Afternoon Tea will be provided during the workshop days, 14-20 March 2011.

Check In: Upon arrival Check Out: 11:00 a.m.

NB: When checking out of the Hotel, do not forget to settle your personal bills (laundry, mini bar, telephone, safe, etc.).

6. TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS AND VISA REQUIREMENTS

The nearest airport servicing Kasane is the Kasane Airport which is about 5 km away from Mowana Safari Lodge. Transfer from the airport to the hotel will be provided by a **shuttle service** from the Hotel. This is a free service and a list with the arrival times of sponsored participants has been furnished to the shuttle service. Non-sponsored participants should advise the hotel of their arrival and departure times in order to schedule the shuttle.

5.1 Visa requirements

Citizens from Angola and Democratic Republic of Congo require visas to enter Botswana. Please arrange with the Botswana Embassy or Consulate in your country. Participants that need a visa to enter Botswana will be required a transit visa if passing through South Africa. The transit visa cannot be processed in Botswana kindly ensure that you have it before you leave your home country and it's processed at the South African Embassy.

To facilitate the issuance of visas, the CBD Secretariat will issue, upon request, an invitation letter to be attached to the visa applications.

7. INTERNET ACCESS AND MOBILE PHONES

Wifi internet is available at the hotel and it can only be accessed in the <u>conference room</u>, the <u>lobby</u> and <u>savuti bar</u>. It is free of charge. There is also a business centre in the hotel where relevant charges will be applied to the user.

Some international cellular phones may not be operational in Botswana, it is recommended you check with your provider in advance for roaming options. However the communications tools are available in Kasane with several mobile networks. Three network companies providing such services are Orange, Mascom & beMobile. One can purchase sim-cards from airport, filling stations or super markets at a price cost between **10-20 pula**. Call rates differ from each network company. Internet services are also available from these networks.

8. WEATHER AND TIME ZONE INFORMATION

The weather in Kasane is sunny and hot nearly all year round, with hot summers and mild winters. Currently (January-March) it is the rainfall season with heavy showers at times. The average temperatures range between a **maximum of 28-34**°C and a **minimum of 20-24**°C.

The standard time zone will be UTC/GMT + 2 hours.

9. IMPORTANT HEALTH NOTICE: MALARIA

Botswana is currently experiencing heavy rainfalls countrywide and Kasane is one of the few places that often get heavy downpours, which brings great risk of Malaria infection. The Ministry of Health in the country has warned of the likelihood of high levels of malaria transmission this year due to the above normal rainfall experienced. Therefore, since everyone is at the risk of malaria infection, people are advised to take necessary preventive measures and precautions to protect themselves. People are encouraged to use insect repellents and wear clothes that cover arms and legs especially during the evening as well as sleeping under treated mosquito nets where possible. Anyone who develops the following symptoms; fever, severe headache, chills, sweating, abdominal pains, nausea and vomiting must visit the nearest health facility.

For more information, please consult a medical professional with regard to the vaccination requirements for your travel.

10. OFFICIAL LANGUAGES

The official languages used in Botswana are Setswana and English which are widely and equally used in hotels and restaurants.

11. CURRENCY AND RATES OF EXCHANGE

Botswana's unit of currency is the Pula (P), which is divided into 100 Thebe (t). The word 'Pula' means rain and 'thebe' means shield. The shield appears on the national coat of arms. Bank notes come in denominations of P10, 20, 50 and 100, and coins in denominations of 5t, 10t, 25t, 50t, P1, P2 and P5.

Major credit cards, including Visa, MasterCard, American Express and Diners Club, are accepted widely. Most hotels and lodges accept foreign currency or travellers' cheques


The current exchange rate as of 28 January 2011 is approximately:

1 Pula = 1.0217 SA rand 1 Pula = 0.1426 US\$ A number of exchange bureaux are available in Kasane and you are advised to use those official bureaux for exchange procedures. You can also carry out the transaction at the Lodge but be informed that the exchange rates in hotels are slightly lower than in official bureaux and banks.

Please note: Never change money outside official bureaux. The Hotel also accepts most major credit cards

12. ELECTRICITY

The electrical currents used in Botswana are **220-Volts** and **60Hertz**. Square and Round sockets are used. (You will need an adaptor for a two pinned cable a e.g. a universal adaptor).

13. SECURITY AND SAFETY

Botswana is a relatively peaceful and crime free country, however you advised to take care of your belongings at all times. Always make sure your properties are not left unattended and are in a secure place. Make sure you carry your money safely.

Kasane is largely regarded as having some of the best wilderness and astoundingly rich wildlife areas in Botswana. Most of its land area is devoted to the national park, reserves and it is unfenced to allow animals to roam wild and free. You are therefore advised to be cautious at all times.

14. OTHER SERVICES AVAILABLE TO PARTICIPANTS

A variety of services are available in Kasane. These include:

- * curio shop where one can buy locally produced goods


