Tourism: \$2.7 Billion




Fisheries \$395 **M**illion

What is the Caribbean Challenge initiative?

1. Political will

2. Funding

3. On-the-ground action

Political will

Protect at least 20% of near-shore marine / coastal environment by 2020

(triple area under protection; 8.4 million ha.)

To achieve this:

 New financial architecture: <u>sustainable funding</u> for protected area systems

(New financial commitment for CCI)

- 4 GEF grants (\$20M)
- TNC (\$20M)
- BMZ/KfW (\$14M)
- USAID (part of \$11M grant)
- Italy (\$1M)

Funding (sustainable financing)

CARIBBEAN
BIODIVERSITY
FUND (CBF)

- Independent
- Permanent endowment
- Phase I: \$40M
- \$32M already pledged by KfW, GEF, TNC
- Grows to > \$100M


- Independent

Funding (assessments and studies)

- Financial assessments protected area systems
- Willingness-to-pay studies
- Economic valuation studies

Funding: innovative mechanisms such as debt-for-climate adaptation swaps

Governments pledged funding for climate adaption




Many Caribbean countries with high debt / GDP
