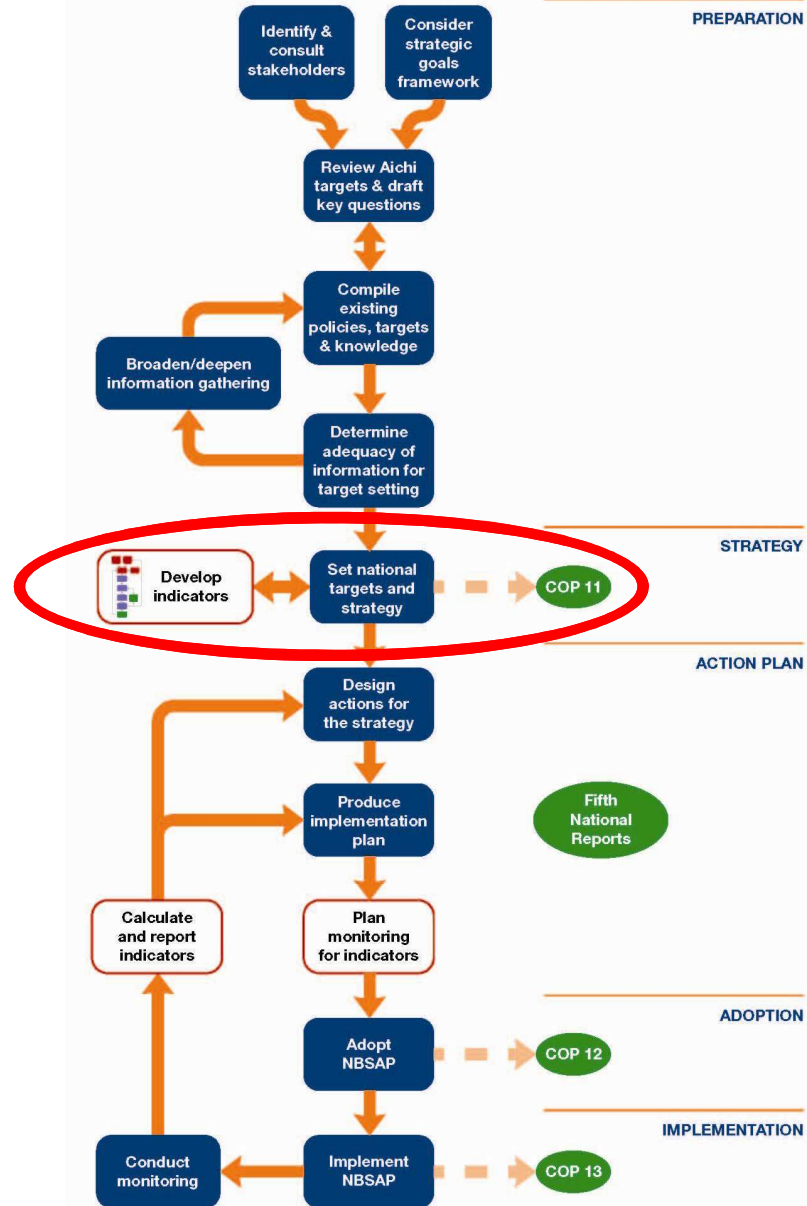

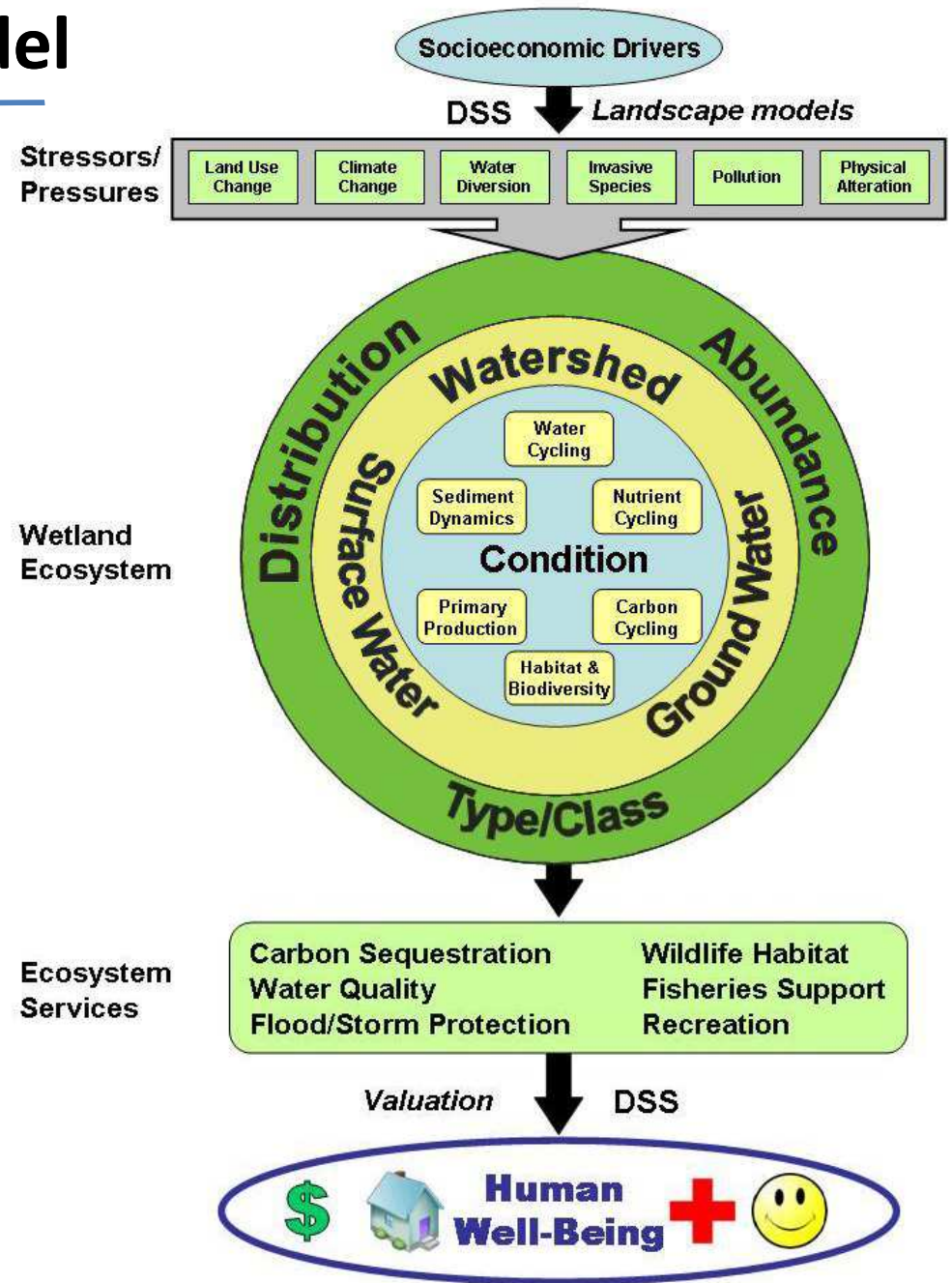
CBD NBSAP Updating Steps



# Conceptual Model

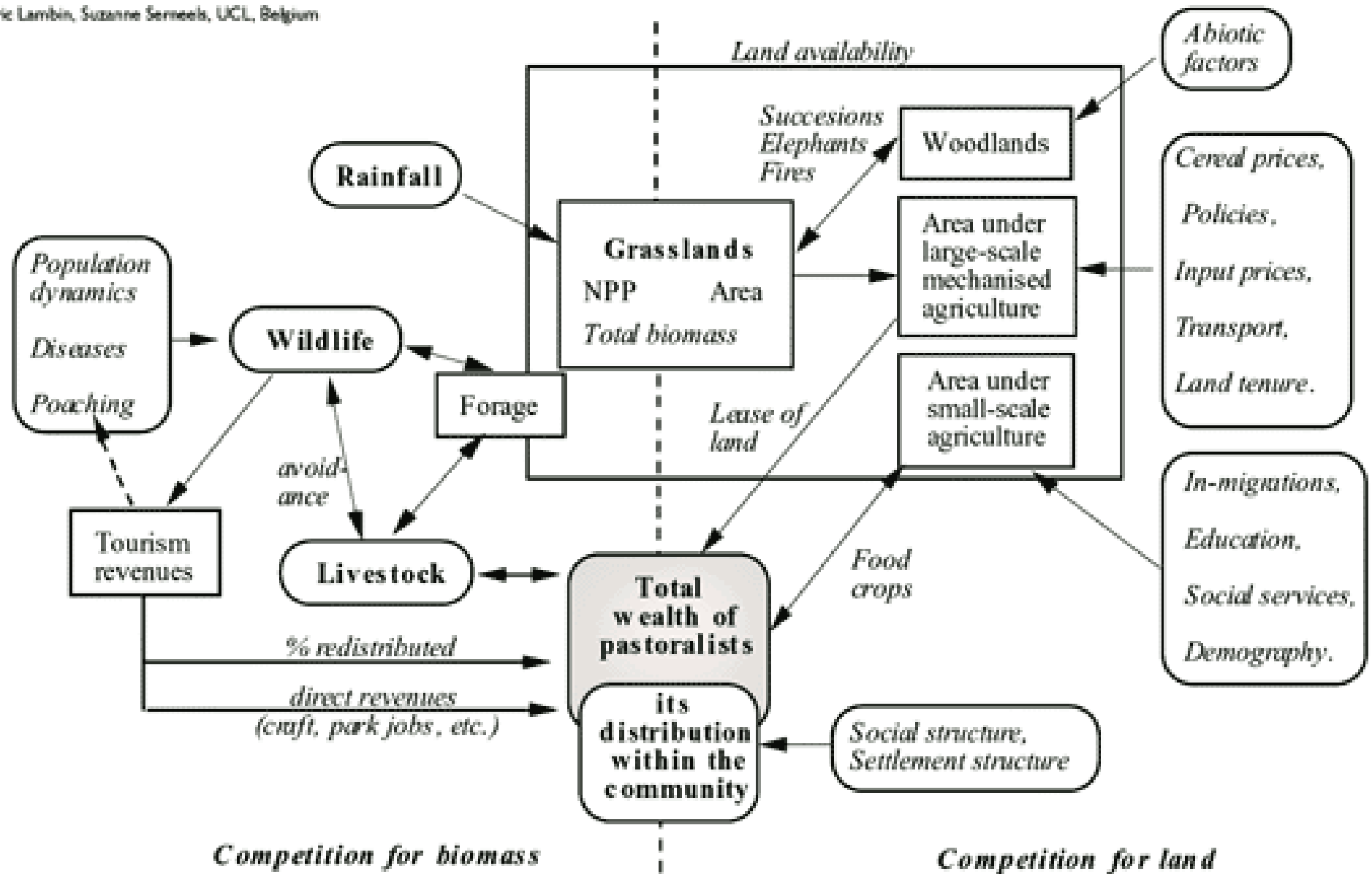
- A diagram that represents the main issues of concern and how they relate to each other.
- It helps to explain the relationship between the elements of a target and possible indicators.
- They exist in all shapes and sizes ranging from simple diagrams with one or two components to intricate models.
