

1. What was the total in FY2008? US\$ 81.4 billion



Biodiversity finance in a wider context

USD 104 billion in 2006 (of which \$19 billion in debt **ODA** relief)1 2.8% for biodiversity (2002-International 05 average)² private capital flows to dev. countries USD 647 billion in 2006 (Global Dev. Finance 2007)³ Developing country exports USD 4,335 billion in 2006 (World Bank, 2007)4

Strategic goal E: Enhance implementation through participatory

- Target 20: By 2020, at the latest, the mobilization of financial resources for effectively implementing the Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011-2020 from all sources and in accordance with the consolidated and agreed process in the Strategy for Resource Mobilization should increase substantially from the current levels. This target will be subject to changes contingent to resources needs assessments to be developed and reported by Parties.




- > Reported funding needs, gaps and priorities

Estimates of the current and future scale of biodiversity finance



Size and control of funds vary with their purpose

Purpose	Size	Source and Budget
Facilitating biodiversity planning implementation and monitoring	\$	Domestic budget or ODA Environment Ministry Budget
Core Biodiversity activities: surveys; protected areas; regulation etc	\$\$	Domestic budget, ODA and other sources Environment Ministry Budget
Mainstreaming in agriculture, forestry, fisheries, education etc	\$\$\$	Domestic budget, ODA, PES, subsidy reform and other sources Budgets of other ministries and private sector
Adaptation to climate change; C sequestration	\$\$\$\$	Climate-related finance
Green economy (sustainable production and consumption)	\$\$\$\$\$\$	All sources All budgets



Principles for the Country-specific resource mobilization strategy

- > Understand: existing sources; budget cycle
- Identify opportunities for new sources
- Mainstream persuade others to spend or reallocate their money
- Involve others; get ownership over biodiversity-friendly activities
- Reform look for opportunities to save money by ceasing support to activities harmful to biodiversity
- Leverage funds under your control
- Make the economic case
- Innovate
- Move beyond a "shopping list" Look not just for funds for projects, but for strategic/ policy/ institutional changes that will mobilize additional resources

GEF funding for the new generation of Biodiversity Enabling Activities

GEF EA as "Foundation" Activities



- Enabling Activities
 were defined by the GEF as:
- "Activities that prepare the foundation to design and implement effective response measures to achieve Convention objectives."
- GEF funding has been provided according to eligibility criteria for the BD window under the GEF and through 'blocks of funds', which can be summarized as follows...

GEF Secretariat Guidance on Biodiversity EA:

"[Enabling Activities] will assist recipient countries to develop national strategies, plans or programs referred to in Article 6 of the **Convention on Biological Diversity, and to identify** components of biodiversity together with processes and activities likely to have significant adverse impacts on conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity pursuant to **Article 7 of the Convention** on Biological Diversity."



GEF Biodiversity Strategy

The first four objectives may be addressed using funding under the System for Transparent Allocation of Resources (STAR)

The fifth objective may be addressed using funds under the Focal Area Set-Aside (FAS), where eligible countries will be able to access up to \$500,000 to implement all four enabling activities.

GEF Support to Biodiversity Enabling Activities

Enabling Activity support could be provided for:

- revising National Biodiversity Strategies and Action Plans (NBSAPs) in line with the CBD's new strategic plan to be adopted at COP-10;
- implementation of guidance related to the Clearing House Mechanism (CHM);
- Biosafety 2nd Report; and
- 5th Biodiversity National Report.
