What is BSP?

- Intergovernmentally agreed approach
- One of 5 IEG outcomes
- More than UNEP
- Consistent with UN reform
- Consistent with Paris declaration on aid effectiveness







What is BSP for?



- Make UNEP more responsive to country needs
- Provide a coherent platform for all actors
- Strengthen cooperation and partnerships + with private sector
- Impact significantly on socioeconomic development in the provision of environmental goods and services.








What is the BSP Approach?

- Build on existing capacities
- National ownership, to sustain capacities
- Bottom up needs assessment based on NCSA, etc
- Coordinated within EMG, UNDG, RC
- Non-duplicative of effort








What are the elements?
