
## Why local governments & biodiversity?



- Sphere of government closest to the people & closest to the ground
- International and national policy → local action
- Mandates for planning & service delivery → biodiversity impact
- Larger in population and geographical size than some nations

Profound effect on ecosystems...




...Profound *reliance* on ecosystems for resilience





## Why Cities & Biodiversity?




- Urbanization severe habitat alteration






## Why "LBSAPs"?



- "Coordination structures (for mainstreaming biodiversity across sectors) may exist, but often with ...limited ownership at the <u>sub-</u> <u>national level</u>"
- "Most NBSAPs place a strong emphasis on planning at the national level, and only a minority explicitly acknowledge the benefits of <u>sub-national BSAPs</u>."
- "...communication of the NBSAP to subnational authorities and the empowerment of these to act has often been unsuccessful due to weak local institutional capacity"
- BUT: "Second generation NBSAPs have typically been prepared through a broader, longer and more structured preparatory process, often including provincial and <u>local</u> levels."

## Why "LBSAPs"?


- 6) "...(there is a) need... to identify and involve subnational stakeholders..."
- 11) ...NBSAPs will only be implemented if corresponding strategies and action plans are also developed and implemented at the relevant subnational level(s)..."
- 18) "...the links between the national and local levels have often been missing in NBSAP preparation and implementation..."; "...wider use of sub-national BSAPs would help address (insufficient community engagement)."
- 20) "...locally-determined and implemented activities are often more COST-Effective and lead to better outcomes than nationally-determined and managed projects."
- 22) "There needs to be increased support for capacity development (for) sub-national implementation".





## Why "LBSAPs"?

- Specific. "<u>A</u>ction <u>P</u>lan" becomes more tangible with dates and people responsible
- Local communities & institutions have specific knowledge on local development opportunities
- A way of collectively assisting national governments to achieve NBSAP objectives; Aichi Targets and CBD Strategic Plan



#### Approaches to compiling LBSAPs

- Stand-alone plans
  - Internal guidance
  - Can include plans for integration
- Integration into broader plans
  - → integrate biodiversity-specific NBSAP goals into broader local planning
  - Trickle-down effect

#### **Recommendations to Parties**

- Involve leading local authorities in NBSAP review to better understand on-the-ground needs and best practice
- Sustained awareness-raising & capacity development at the local level
- Work with the willing
- Work with partners
- Focus funding on aligned objectives
