POVERTY REDUCTION STRATEGY PAPER (PRSP) OBJECTIVES

- (1) To create an enabling policy environment to promote economic growth and poverty reduction
- price stability;
- improve macro-economic management (particularly fiscal and monetary management);
- implement private sector development programme;
- Reduce Government's asset portfolio through privatisation and divestiture
 - (2) To Enhance the productive capacity and social protection of the poor and vulnerable
- change narrow focus on agriculture for approximately 80% of the population;
- institute investment support for Informal Small and Micro-Enterprises (ISMEs);
- provide substantial economic infrastructure support to non-farm business ventures;
- diversify agriculture away from mono-crop agriculture (groundnuts)

POVERTY REDUCTION STRATEGY PAPER OBJECTIVES

- (3) To improve coverage of the basic social service needs of the poor and vulnerable
 - increase access to education, health, and other social amenities (water supply, electricity, sewage disposal, sanitation and telecommunications)
- (4) To build the capacity of local communities and Civil Society Organisations (CSOs) to play an active role in the process of poverty reduction
 - democratize processes and systems to ensure that empowerment results from decentralization
 - create Poverty Reduction Dialogue Forum

POVERTY REDUCTION STRATEGY PAPER OBJECTIVES

- (5) Mainstream poverty-related cross-cutting issues into PRSP
- ensure focus on poverty reduction outcomes at the community levels
- ensure adequate funding of Environment, Nutrition, Population, and HIV-Aids interventions at community levels

MAINSTREAMING BIODIVERSITY CONTD.

- Setting biodiversity conservation as priority during development of GEAP (Gambia Environmental Action Plan), LEAPs (Local Environmental Action Plans) and CAPs (Community Action Plans);
- Promotion of ECOTOURISM at community level helping the diversify the tourism product from <u>sea</u>, <u>sand and sun</u>;
- Introduction of Global Environment Facility Small Grants Programme (Jan. 2007)
