NOTIFICATION

Workshops for indigenous and local communities on web-based technologies, in particular on the CBD Guidelines on Biodiversity and Tourism Development

Dear Madam/Sir,

In paragraph 8 of Decision VII/14, the Conference of the Parties (COP) to the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) "invites Parties, Governments and relevant organizations to provide indigenous and local communities with capacity-building and financial resources to support their active participation in tourism policy-making, development planning, product development and management indicated by the Guidelines". Furthermore, through paragraph 13, and paragraph 6(a) of section D/II, of Decision VIII/5 on Article 8(j) and related provisions, the COP requested the Executive Secretary, in collaboration with Parties, to convene, subject to the availability of financial resources, regional and sub-regional workshops to assist indigenous and local communities in capacity-building, education and training, as well as in using new information and web-based technologies and establishing communication networks.

In light of the above, the Secretariat of the CBD is in the process of organizing a series of training workshops to support capacity-building and exchanges between indigenous people on managing biodiversity and tourism products applying the CBD Guidelines. The workshops will primarily focus on new information and web-based technologies, and will test and assess participative planning tools.

In recognition of the International Polar Year (IPY) 2007-2008, the Secretariat is organizing the first workshop in the Arctic region, which will be held tentatively from 19 to 23 November 2007 in Quebec City, Canada, as part of a global initiative entitled *Indigenous Communities, Tourism and Biodiversity Workshop Series: New Information and Web-based Technologies*. Concerned Parties have been individually approached with regards to the first event. Similar workshops are planned to be organized in Latin America, Africa and Southeast Asia, with a focus on forest basins, islands and mountains.

I look forward to contacting you in due time with regards to your participation in this initiative and thank you for your continued contribution to the work of the Convention.
