Capacity Development Workshop for Central Asia on National Biodiversity Strategies and Action Plans and the mainstreaming of biodiversity

I am pleased to inform you that a regional capacity development workshop for the Central Asia on national biodiversity strategies and action plans (NBSAP) and the mainstreaming of biodiversity will be held in **Ramsar**, **Iran**, **from 9 to 13 March 2009**.

This workshop is being organized by the Secretariat of the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) in collaboration with the Department of the Environment of the Islamic Republic of Iran and the Ramsar Regional Centre, with the financial support of the governments of Canada and Norway.

Through an exchange of experiences and training on the use of relevant tools and mechanisms, the purpose of the workshop is to strengthen national capacity for the development, implementation, review and updating of NBSAPs and the mainstreaming of biodiversity into relevant sectors, in line with COP decisions VIII/8 and IX/8, as well as the finalization of the fourth national reports.
