Please refer to my earlier notification 2012-155 of 21 December 2012, regarding a regional Workshop on the Inter-Linkages between Human Health and Biodiversity in Africa to be held in Maputo, Mozambique from 2-5 April 2013. The deadline for nominations has now been extended to **15 February 2013**. If you have not already done so, I invite you to nominate one representative of your government, at your earliest convenience but not later than **Friday 15 February 2013**, to participate in the regional workshop based on the criteria outlined in the above notification. The Secretariat will be in a position to support the participation of one nomination by the CBD National Focal Point from eligible Parties.

Please note that priority will be given to countries that submit nominations of one representative from the Ministry of the Environment and one from the Ministry of Health. A separate process is in place to gather nominations from the Ministry of Health, with support of the World Health Organization regional office for Africa (WHO/AFRO). Given the limited availability of funds, participants are urged to submit their nominations as soon as possible.

CBD National Focal Points should provide the name and contact details of their nominee via official signed letter addressed to the Executive Secretary by the deadline (faxed to +1 (514) 288-6588, or scanned and attached to an e-mail addressed to secretariat@cbd.int).
