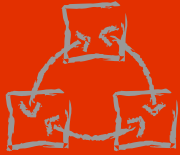

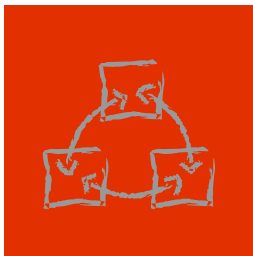
- National Capacity Self-Assessment

 - To **plan** for a capacity development strategy for environmental management



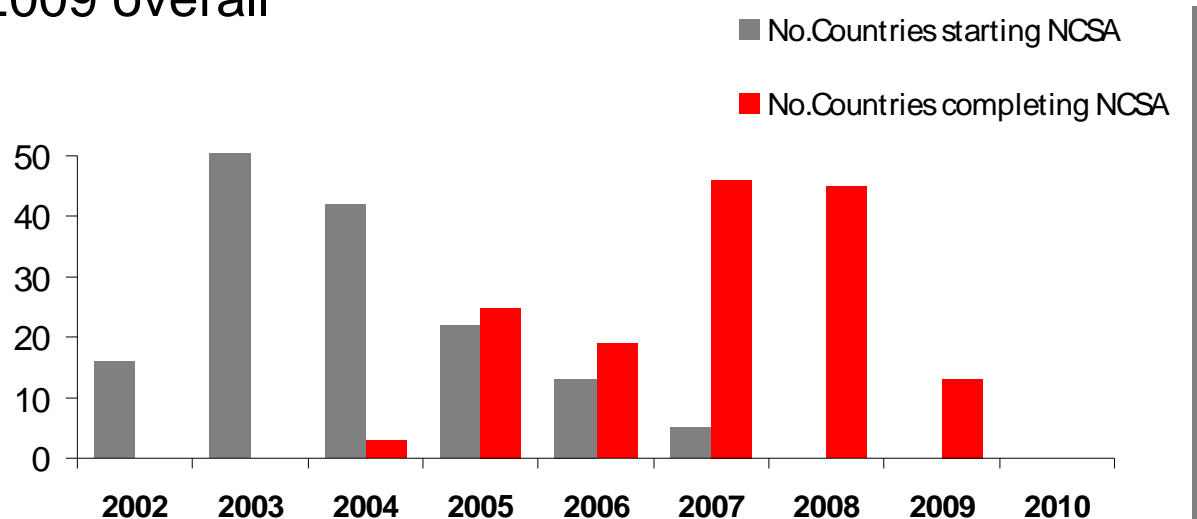
- Emerging Lessons

 - A capacity-focus supports mainstreaming of environmental strategies into national development planning



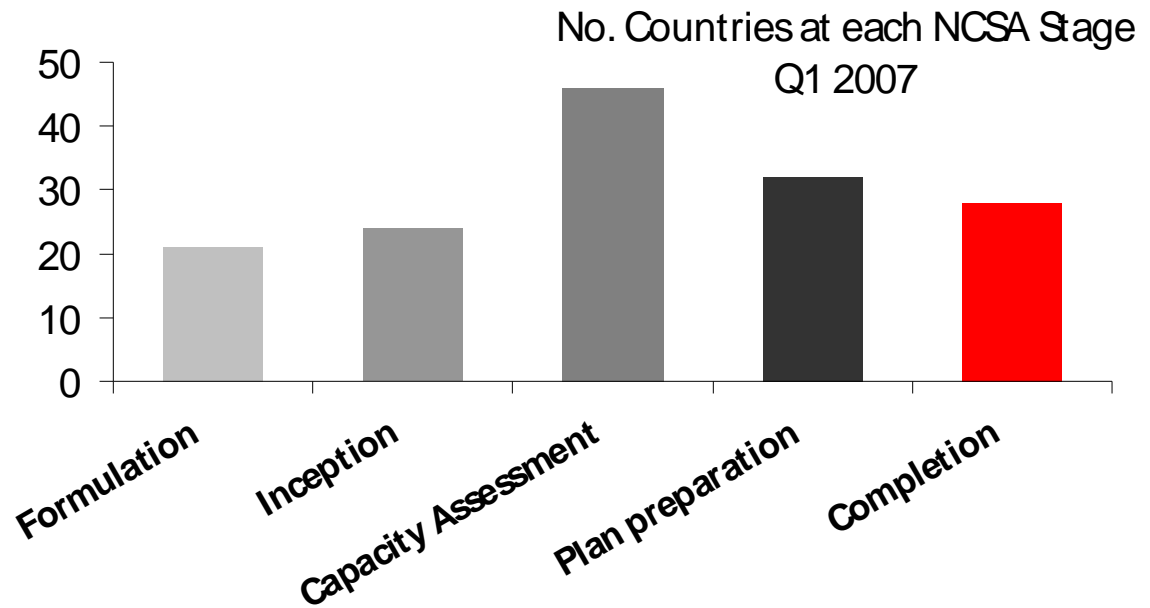
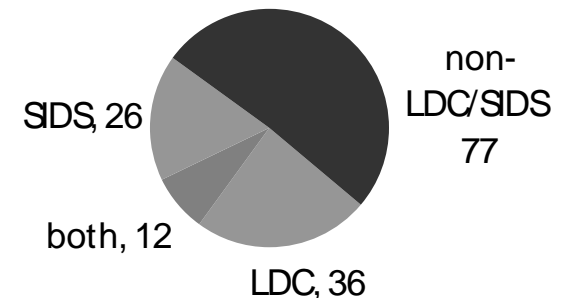
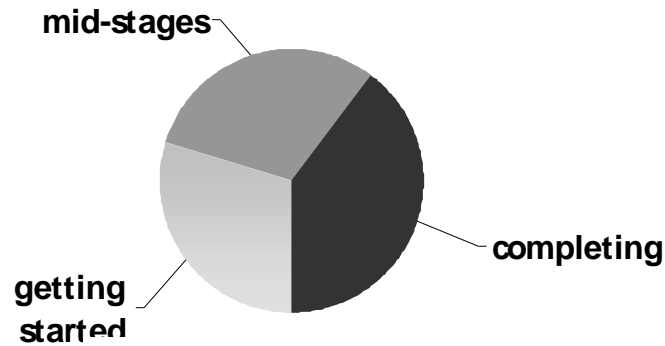
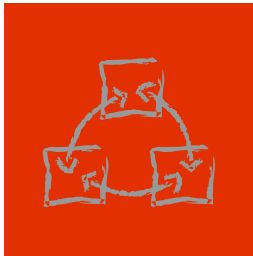
NCSA - Programme implementation



- GEF Enabling Activity
- 152 countries
 - 116 UNDP + 35 UNEP (+1 WB)
- Duration
 - intended 12-18 months; actual 15-60 months;
 - median increasing from 24 to 36 months.
- 2002 – 2009 overall

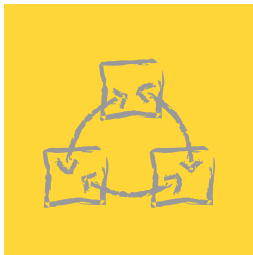


NCSA - Programme status - Q1 2007



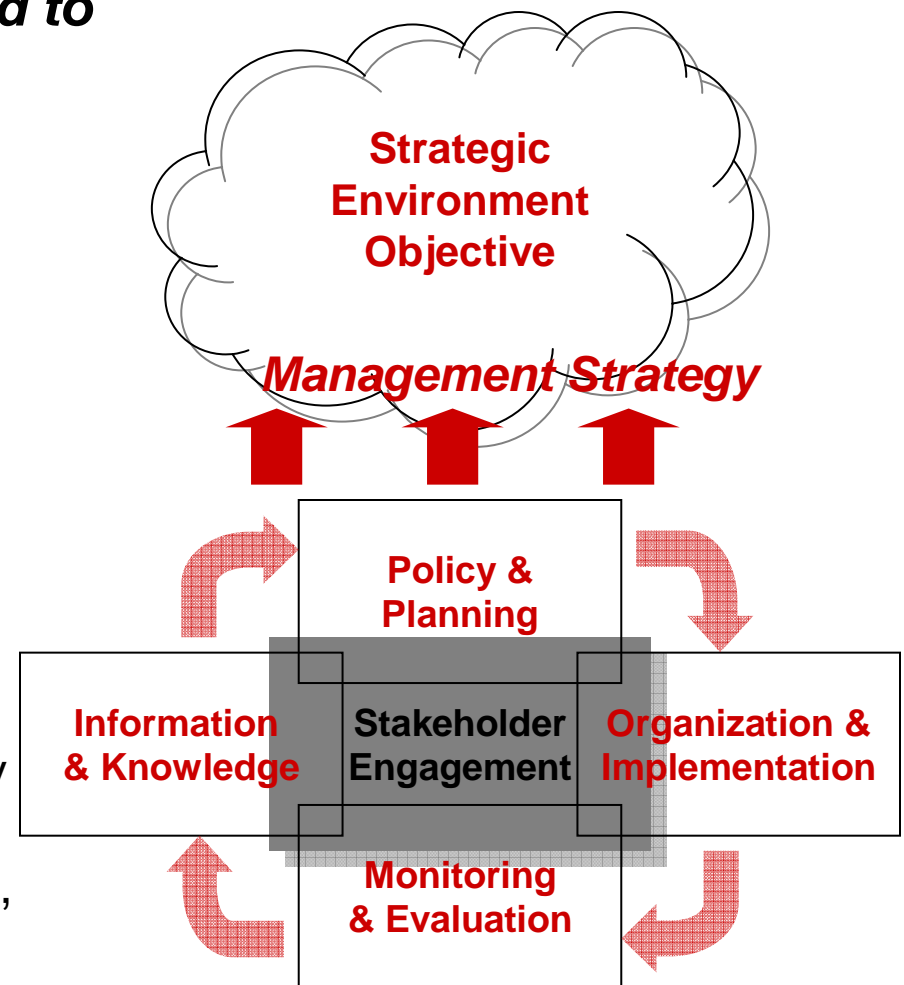
Synthesis - What Capacity needs?

*A set of capacities needed to establish and uphold a management system...
...to address priority environmental issues*

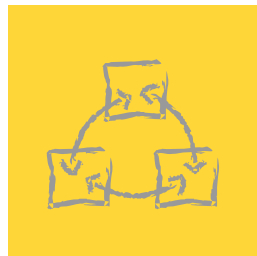


Five linked Capacity Sets:

1. for **stakeholders** to engage with one another
2. to access and use **information**, to diagnose and communicate
3. to **plan**, form strategy, design solutions, set policy
4. to organize and **implement** actions, to test, introduce and sustain solutions
5. to **monitor, evaluate**, learn and adapt.

Stakeholder Engagement

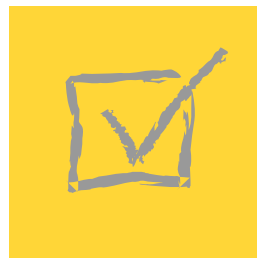
Mandates; organization of lead agency; co-management arrangements; cooperation between stakeholders; partnerships



Information & Knowledge

Research, science; Information access &

sharing; communications; awareness; traditional knowledge



Planning & Policy

Planning and strategy development; decision-making; regulatory frameworks



Organization & Implementation

Mobilization of resources; technical skills

& technology transfer; execution of programmes and projects

Monitoring & Evaluation

Monitoring, evaluation, feedback & learning

Synthesis - Capacity for What ?

- Capacity development is not an end in itself but needs to serve a substantive environmental objective

BD examples from the NCSA action plans:

- biodiversity conservation
- sustainable use of BD
- endangered species
- invasive alien species
- de-forestation
- agro-biodiversity
- habitat damage
- bio-safety
- access & benefit sharing

Lessons - for NCSA/ EA implementation



- Agree on a clear, strategic purpose with key stakeholders



- “Institutionalize” the planning process
 - to create engagement & inter-agency coordination & ownership....



- Use Enabling Activities to actually enhance your capacities
 - E.g. in stakeholder engagement, information management, planning & policy development, project & process management, M&E



Lessons - for an effective action plan

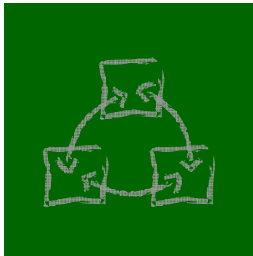


- Prepare a **plan** that will be **acted upon**
 - Structured as a broad framework with a hierarchy of objectives - a logical framework approach.
 - Specifying how and by whom its implementation, monitoring and continuation will be managed.
 - Aimed towards substantive environment & sustainable development objectives.
 - Connected to other national environment & development plans and strategies.

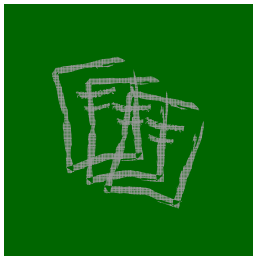


Lessons - for an effective Capacity action

plan



- Determine management and capacity development strategy for environmental priority issues (A. B. C.)
- Identify common CD needs across several strategies.

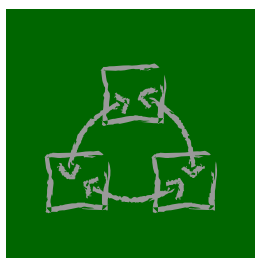


Lessons - connect with and build on other EAs

Lessons - using the NCSA/ EA to mainstream...

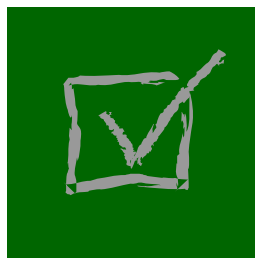


- Develop capacity

- Strengthen national capacities for environmental management

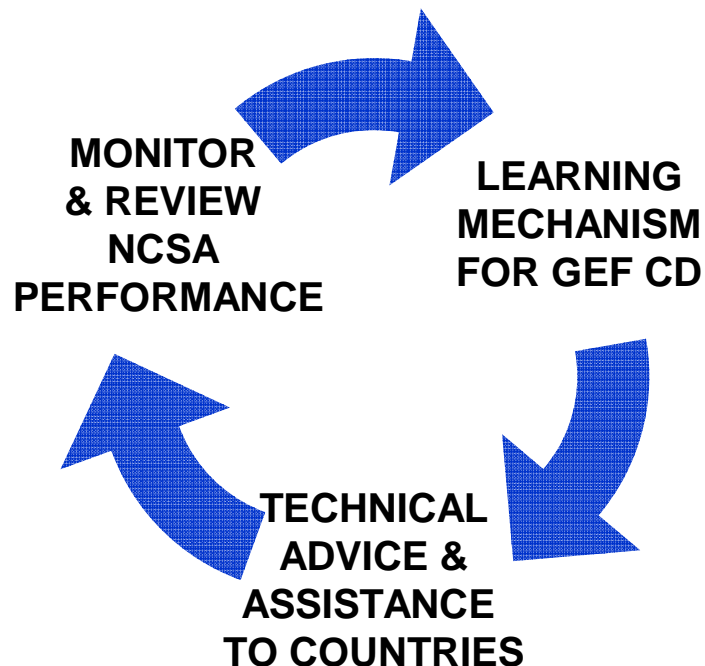
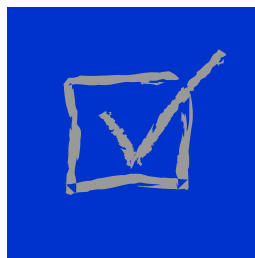
- To allow for issue-specific projects and programmes to gain a foothold.
