Further to question 70, yet, no measure has been taken for the conservation of biodiversity outside the forest land. Some wetland, rivers and agricultural areas should be brought under protected area management system. Some legislative measures should be taken to preserve the biodiversity and gene pool outside the forest land.

Further to question 73, An appropriate and comprehensive guidelines for the selection, establishment and management of protected area is yet to be made. Bangladesh is in the process of establishing the same.

Further to question 74, Attempts are being made to mange biological resources important for the conservation of biological diversity with a view to ensuring their conservation and sustainable use. In Bangladesh 3 categories of protected areas, namely National Parks, Wildlife Sanctuary and Game Reserve have been established under the provision of Bangladesh Wildlife (Preservation) (Amendment) Act, 1974. These three categories of protected area have covered more than 126000 ha area of different ecosystems of the country. Bangladesh has further declared more than 40,0000 ha. Of some priority ecosystems as Ecologically Critical Area (ECA) under Environmental Conservation Act 1995.

Further to question 125, joint efforts should be undertaken by the Bangladesh National Herbarium and the National Botanical Garden for implementation of ex situ conservation initiatives in Bangladesh.

More botanical gardens, arboretums, eco-parks, ex-situ conservation stands, seed orchards, clonal archives etc. should be developed in different ecoregions of the country. More gene pool (seed, pollen, DNA) stand should be created. That will create opportunity for ex-situ conservation of different species/germ plasm exists in the different ecosystem.

Further to question 126, limiting. National Institute of Plant Genetic Resources (NIPGR) is started with our own resources. Government has sanctioned only Tk.50 lakh for the first year and Tk.2000 lakh for the second year. Further work will depend on the availability of fund from donors.

Further to question 131 research facilities is still very limited. Attempts are being made to improve research facilities and make best use of genetic resources.

Further to question 132, BARI, BRRI, BJRI, BTRI and BFRI have established and maintained facilities for the *ex situ* conservation of some agricultural and forest crops in active collaboration with organizations in other countries.

Further comments on implementation of this Article

Further to question 196, environmental conservation (amendment) Act, 2000 and Environmental conservation Rules, 1997 are already in place. But proper enforcement of those are limited. Sufficient provision has been made in the Environment Conservation Act, 1995, amendment, 2000, and Environment Conservation Rules, 1997 in respect of Environmental Impact Assessment so as to minimize the adverse impact on biodiversity and their habitat.

Further to question 197, presently EIA reports are reviewed by multi disciplining team of the Department of Environment with no participation of general public representative but sometimes concerned entrepreneur are asked to participate in the EIA review meeting to clarify the situation and to make them aware regarding the mitigation measures/Environment activities etc.

Further to question 198, all the national programs/project are reviewed likewise the EIA reports so as to asses the environmental consequences and to mitigate the adverse effect on biodiversity. At policy level provision has been made in the prescribed TAPP/PP of the national planning commission to identify the environmental impact due to the activities of the projects which covers the biodiversity aspects to some extent but no direct mention of the consequence on the biodiversity specifically mentioned in the said format.

Further to question 199, although Bangladesh not involved directly in the bilateral, regional and is or multilateral discussion on activities likely to significantly affect biological diversity out side the country's jurisdiction. Indirectly some To anticipation is made through SARRC/SACEP on environmental aspects in general which also cover to a limited extend on the aspect of biodiversity.

Further to question 204, Bangladesh is in the process of signing a MoU on Regional Oil Spill Contingency Plan which includes the Seas Region of South Asian Countries such as Bangladesh, India, Maldives, Pakistan and Sri Lanka which will address the issues of South Asian Regional Coastal and Marine Biodiversity. Moreover, a draft National Marine Pollution plan has also been prepared by Bangladesh and already been reviewed inter-ministrially for finalizing the same. This will also facilitate the implementation of the Regional Oil Spill Contingency Plan.

Further comments on implementation of this Article

Further to question 216, the relative priority afforded to implementation of Article 15 and associated in Bangladesh is of low priority. The resources available for meeting the obligations and recommendations are severely limiting. Bangladesh has not yet endeavoured to create conditions to facilitate access to genetic by other Parties.

Yet there is no understanding or agreement between interested groups on access to genetic resources. Regarding Article 15(5) no provision has yet been developed. About Article 15(6) some initiatives have been taken for agricultural crop diversity like potato, wheat, pulses etc. Bangladesh Agricultural Research Institute is working with these crops in collaboration with other international institutions. About he equitable sharing of the results of research and development as stated in Article 15(7) no measure has been taken by Bangladesh. Yet the country has not provided the secretariat with information on relevant legislation, administration and policy measures. The country has not yet implemented any capacity building programme to promote and not analyzed the legislative, administrative and policy measures. The country has not yet implemented any capacity building programme to promote and not analyzed the legislative, administrative and policy measures. Collaboration with different stakeholders to explore, develop and implement guidelines has not been started. No national authority for granting the access to genetic resources been identified. The country is taking active role in negotiations associated with the adaptation of the International Undertaking of Plant Genetic Resources, as; it has collaborative activities with organization like IPGRI etc.

Further to question 220, prior Informed Concept is being developed and integrated in New Plant Varieties Protection Act (draft). Draft New Plant Varieties Protection Act for agriculture sector is in the process of approval.

Further to question 221, Bangladesh has been receiving genetic materials from CIMMYT, IRRI, AVRDC, ICRISAT, etc.

Further to question 221, Bangladesh participate in International undertaking of PGR for Food and Agriculture.

Further to question 238, the implementation of this article does not arise at this stage unless the acts are finalized.

The relative priority afforded to implementation of Article 16 and associated decision of the Article in Bangladesh is of low priority. The resources available for meeting the obligations and recommendations are severely limiting. No measure has been taken to provide and facilitate access for an transfer of technology to other Contracting Parties. However, the country is aware about the initiatives of technlogy transfer on concessional or preferential terms. As mentioned earlier the country has not yet developed any legislative measures for access to genetic resources, still different organizations like Bangladesh Agricultural Research Institute, Bangladesh Forest Research Institutes are sharing their research results with other regional and international research organizations. About he Article 16(4) no private sector has been developed nor the country has taken measures to facilitate access to joint development and transfer of relevant technology transfer. No intellectual property right system has been developed. Still nothing about policy on property rights or case study has been communicated with the secretariat.
