Since 1994 Denmark has followed up on the decisions taken at the 1992 Earth Summit in Rio de Janeiro through granting additional funding (additional to the ordinary Danish development assistance) for environmental assistance including assistance for sustainable management of natural recourses in countries in Central and Eastern Europe, South-East Asia, Southern Africa and in the Artic.

The Danish environmental assistance is guided by strategies and managed through a number of agencies and ministries each having specialist knowledge on programmes and approaches. The programmes are financed through the Environment, Peace and Stability Fund established in 1993. The environmental part of the funds budget will gradually be increased until 2005 where it will reach 0.25 % of the Danish CDP. The funds earmarked to environmental assistance amounted to DKK 3.2 billion in 1998. In addition, the general Danish development assistance has also integrated environment as a cross cutting issue in its programme; this assistance scheme constitutes 1 % of the Danish GNP.

Areas to be supported include:

- Enhancing the countries capacity to participate in international environments agreements and collaboration (e.g. the Montreal, Basel; Climate Change and Biodiversity Conventions).
- Strengthening the environmental management capacity of regional, national and local institutions and agencies, including support for programmes for delegating environmental competence to local administrations and users.
- Environmental co-operation between the public and the private sector (South-South and North-South co-operation).
- Support for training and awareness activities aimed at creating a broader understanding of environmental issues among the population, decision-makers and administrators.
- Development of practicable methods of environmental analysis and relevant environmental indicators including exchange of data, mapping, surveillance and monitoring of regional environmental matters.
- Preparation of reports on the state of the environment, including strengthening the capacity to use and undertake EIA and green environmental audits, e.g for large infrastructure projects, irrigation system and dams, etc.
- Increased collaboration on research, training and technology and skills transfer amongst the countries and building up environmental networks in the region.
- Pilot projects and smaller demonstration facilities where the knowledge and capacity developed can be disseminated in the region.
- Activities aimed at improving the interior and exterior working environment of the projects.
- Activities aimed at promoting active popular participation in enhanced environmental co-operations at all levels and in individual activities.

The Danish government is preparing the following contributions to the Rio + 10 Conference on Environment and Development in 2002:

• A national strategy for sustainable development.

The strategy will present the Danish vision and objectives for sustainable development taking into account areas of sector-integration and set both short-term and long-term objectives for sustainable development. The strategy will deal with problems related to climate change, environmental and health problems in relation to the wide-spread use of chemicals, the relations between environment and health, and the on-going loss of biodiversity. The strategy will include a view on the global sustainable development and the Danish contribution to this development. A part of the strategy will deal with public awareness and participation in the processes.

• A national action plan on biodiversity and nature protection.

A committee has been set up to review the Danish follow-up on the Convention on Biological Diversity and the EC Habitat and Birds Directives. The work will also be based on the OECD's 1999 environmental performance review of Denmark. The main objective is to assess how biodiversity conservation can be strengthened in Denmark i..a. through greater integration of consideration for nature in agriculture, forestry and fishery. The action plan will include target areas to improve the conservation of biodiversity on a national scale and set up precise objectives and timeframes. The Danish contribution and participation in the international work on biodiversity will be included as will considerations about public awareness and the need for further research.

The Danish government is also involved in the strategy for sustainable development in the Nordic countries and neighbouring areas. This Nordic strategy will also be a contribution to the Rio + 10 summit.

Finally, the Government is taking active part in the formulation of a 6^{th} Environmental Program of the European Union with biodiversity as one of four main themes.

Ad 155:

Destination 21 is a labelling scheme for tourist destinations working towards sustainable tourism development by involving all stakeholders in the development process.

The Danish Tourism Board in association with the Danish NGO's began the development of a destination-labelling scheme in 1997 in order to promote sustainable tourism development at a destination level. The development of the recognition scheme was born out of the need to address the lack of a strategy for sustainable tourism in Denmark. The aim is also to provide an association or forum in which Danish tourism actors will be able to obtain information and guidance and exchange knowledge in their efforts to develop their industry sustainably in accordance with the principles outlined in Agenda 21.

The scheme is based upon a geographically defined area in which the municipality or municipalities strive to implement Local Agenda 21's principals in their tourism policies. It is the scheme's aim to not only promote sustainability within the planning framework for tourism and the associated products and services, but also the development of sustainability for the entire region. Therefore in order to ascertain the status of Destination 21, the region must not only work with the tourism infrastructure but also with all other resources and industries within the region. Destination 21 strives to safeguard the destination's continued basis for existence by involving the natural environment, economic and cultural conditions, increased integration between the tourist trade, the local business community and public administration as well as actively involving the local population.

A number of Destination 21 areas will be nominated in 2001.

Education in biological diversity and sustainable development is an integrated part of the Danish education system at all levels - from basic schools to universities.

To support this development, Denmark has built up a new education scheme with the aim to trainee Danish nature interpreters.

"The Danish Interpreter Service" offers a basic training course to people who can prove that they are employed as nature interpreters and who use a considerable part of their working time on nature interpretation.

Since 1989 approximately 20 nature interpreters have been trained every year. The course, which is organised by the Ministry of Environment and Energy, is adjusted on a regular basis to the demands and needs of the present.

The course comprises practical training which has as its point of departure the Nature Interpreter's own experience, knowledge and skills and thus increases his/her competence as a professional nature interpreter. This is achieved by strengthening the Nature Interpreters' flexibility in the way they deal with different situations, their pedagogical insight and ability to reflect on their own way of doing things.
