## Please provide information on any particular circumstances in your country that are relevant to understanding the answers to the questions in this report

The State of Grenada includes the islands of Carriacou and Petit Martinique and several uninhabited islands. Grenada is populated by 101,000 persons within a 340 km<sup>2</sup> area. The population is mainly concentrated along the coasts which covers about 150 km<sup>2</sup> area. Grenada is classified as a Small Island Developing State with a per capita GDP (2001) of US \$4,300.

The services sector including tourism and tourism related activities constitute the corner stone of economic activities. The agricultural sector is in a state of decline but its contribution to GDP, income and employment in the rural economy is significant. Coastal activities are significant. The island is prone to natural disasters including hurricanes and storms, flooding and volcanic activity. There is an active undersea volcano Kick em' Jenny located between the main islands of Grenada and Carriacou.

The Government is committed to the objectives of the Biodiversity Convention and has signed and ratified the Protocol and is instituting systems for the effective management of the islands' biodiversity. Grenada has completed the National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan and has completed and submitted the First National Report to the Conference of Parties. The COP has established programmes of work that respond to a number of Articles. Please identify the relative priority accorded to each theme and the adequacy of resources. The Ministry of Finance, Industry and Planning serves as the focal point while various activities take place on the level of other ministries and line departments and the NGO community.

The National priorities are set within the framework of the Public Sector Investment Programme and the Medium Term Economic Strategy which are produced by the Ministry of Finance, Industry and Planning.

The Government may wish to establish a body of focal points to the various Conventions to report on cooperation issues among them. Sustainability of activities under this article is in question based on the levels and timing of external resources.

In addition, there are other Conventions which will assist in Conserving biological diversity. E.g. The RAMSAR Convention on wetlands includes the Conservation of Coastal Habitat (Mangroves, Sea grasses and Coral reefs) and provides institutional as well as financial support to Signatories.

There are several externally funded Projects to this end and the information shared therefore are made available to the regional and international organisations. Grenada has an active programme to protect endangered species. Capacity constraints limit the effective implementation. There is heightened public awareness in Grenada but the enforcement mechanisms are inadequate.

### Further comments on implementation of this Article

The Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries have embarked on several initiatives for protection of ecosystems, habitats and endangered species. Government had enunciated several policy statements in this regard.

The Ministry of Tourism have been collaborating with various Ministries relating to activities in protected areas.

Activities under this Article are driven by externally funded Projects. Significant capacity constraints exists.

Local interest in these areas are usually driven by economic importance and in many cases this is overruled by economics.

E.g. Woburn Bay was declared an MPA, not only because of its scenic beauty (aesthetics) but because it possesses important habitat (mangroves, sea grass, coral reefs) and serves as a nursery and grow out area for economic fish species (although not much fishing occurs in the area).

At the same time, other activities of supposedly by higher economic value is also present (marinas, resorts, desalination plants etc).

Increasingly, whereas major developments are proposed, EIA's are required prior to development approval / denial.

Draft National Physical Development Plan - land use zoning will help in the protection of conservation areas.

Physical Planning and Development Control Act Part IV of the Act specifies the activities that constitute development of land and makes all such activities subject to development control. Applications for development are made to the Authority and in many, users must be the subject of an EIA.

Part IV of the Act requires the Authority to protect the natural and cultural heritage of Grenada by listing buildings, making preservation orders, declaring heritage protection areas and designating special natural areas.
