•Question4: Related to national policies

Counter-measures against alien species are stipulated in the National Strategy on Biological Diversity as follows.

(Extract: Basic Policies on counter-measures against impacts of alien species)

Alien species from outside the country or the area may cause a loss of biological diversity through cross-breeding with similar indigenous species, generic pollution by crossbreeding with existing local populations, and ecosystem disturbance by preying on other species and occupying habitats. Measures are thus required either to prevent immigration or exterminate alien species. The risk of alien species greatly changing local biota and ecosystems is especially strong on island, which are isolated from other regions and are homes for endemic biota.

It is also necessary appropriately to control the invasion of animals and plants which may have adverse effects on agricultural, forestry and fishery industries.
