There was a research project on integrated coastal management in two places of Korea. A project on sustainable use and conservation of coastal nature resources at a saltwater lake, Shihwa Lake and a bay will be finished in 2001 as a case study on ICM.

There is no typical coral reef in Korean waters, but there is similar phenomenon, whitening phenomenon changing from useful brown algae to white coraline algae on rocky reef. This phenomenon is being widely expanded especially in east and south coast of Korea. The reason is not cleared yet.
