### Further comments on implementation of this Article

Sweden has produced three national overviews on alien species ("Alien species in terrestrial environments", "Alien Species in the marine environment" and "Alien species in freshwater environments") - all in Swedish. Sweden has cooperated with the other Nordic countries in preparing a report "Introduced Species in the Nordic Countries". Although the need for future cooperation with the other Nordic countries is clear, the form for such work has not yet been determined. As the work with alien species is decentralized in Sweden, with 11 different government agencies responsible for different aspects of alien species, it is difficult to reach central decisions as to the form of cooperation with other countries.

Work with developing a Clearing House Mechanism for Biological Diversity is in progress in Sweden. Information on alien species is a part of the CHM. Information on alien species will be available through the CHM to the general public as well as to scientists and environmental authorities in Swedish and English.

Sweden will participate in the Baltic Workshop on Alien Species sponsored in part by GISP in May 2001. This will hopefully initiate cooperation with the

In Sweden, alien species is defined as to include alien genotypes such as exogenous subspecies and populations. Introduction of exogenous populations of species already occurring in an area may be harmful to biological diversity on the gene level, and constitute an equally important potential threat as the introduction of an alien species. Work with providing recommendations for introductions of alien populations is ongoing in Sweden, and some research programmes addressing these issues are also in progress.

This report presents an analysis of the ecological consequences of forestry with Canadian lodgepole pine introduced into Sweden. The report includes a com-pilation of present knowledge in the area, research priorities based on the knowledge gaps found, and proposed measures for dealing with the negative environmental consequences that could arise. Researchers from various countries, with special competence in relevant areas of subject, carried out the data compilations and literature reviews providing the basis of the analysis. This basic information will be published in a special issue of the scientific journal Forest Ecology and Management. The point of departure of the analysis is a description of the properties of lodgepole pine, including species-specific characteristics of the tree, and changes in stand environment and silvicultural management practices that can be expected. The report describes the dispersal capacity of lodgepole pine in its new Swedish environment and the

effects of host-parasite interactions. Thereafter, ecological effects on the capacity of the soil for sustainable production and on biological diversity at various scales (tree, stand, landscape) are analysed. Lodgepole-pine forestry is also considered in relation to current laws and regulations as well as national and international environmental goals. At the end of the report, a strategy is proposed for handling the inevitable uncertainties associated with the introduction of exotic species. In connection with this strategy, three main points are emphasised:

General caution should be used; a monitoring programme should be established, and contingency plans should be drawn up so that any eventual problems can be dealt with effectively.
