Part of the information has been derived from the draft National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan which was prepared through national workshops involving government agencies, private sector, research institutions, NGOs, local governments and the media. Thematic aspects of the questionnaire were sent to lead agencies for inputs which were then returned and incorporated in the report. Specific reports were received from the Forest Department, Ministry of Water, Lands and Environment; Uganda Wildlife Authority, Botanical Gardens, National Agricultural Research Organization; Lake Victoria Environment Management Project; Zoology and Botany Departments, Makerere University; Makerere Institute of Environment and Natural Resources.

Please provide information on any particular circumstances in your country that are relevant to understanding the answers to the questions in this report

Uganda signed and ratified the Convention on Biological Diversity in 1992 and 1993 respectively. Since then Uganda has implemented certain Articles of the Convention including Articles 6,15,19,21 and a few others.

However, most people especially the local communities who are the primary resource users have very little knowledge of the Convention on Biological Diversity. Direct input to the report therefore came from restricted sources mainly at national level. The country has now embarked on some initiatives aimed at popularising the conventions at local and national levels.

The COP has established programmes of work that respond to a number of Articles. Please identify the relative priority accorded to each theme and the adequacy of resources. Further comments on work programmes and priorities

There is need to integrate these COP programmes as they relate to inland water biodiversity, agrobiodiversity, forest biodiversity and dry and sub-humid lands (i.e. the savannah woodlands in which most of our National Parks and forest reserves fall) in planning processes both at national and local levels. Although some work is going on sectorally, there is lack of coordination between sectors. There is also need to prepare national master plans which balance food production, economic development and natural resource conservation. There is also need to recognize the importance of biodiversity outside protected areas.

Examples of such cooperation include participation in the GEF-East African Cross-border biodiversity project (between Kenya, Tanzania and Uganda), Kagera Basin Organisation (between Uganda, Tanzania, Rwanda), Nile Basin Organization (Uganda, Sudan, Egypt), Lake Victoria Environment management project (Uganda, Kenya, Tanzania. International Conventions are presently coordinated by different government agencies with limited coordination. Coordination needs be to improved between conventions such as CBD, CITES, CMS, RAMSAR, UNFCCC and CCD in order to reduce duplication of efforts.

Further comments on implementation of these decisions

The national needs identification and assessment in Taxonomy has been attempted by the Ugandan arm of Eastern African
Biosystematics Network of BIONET International but this was not a government initiative and is not well known. The contact institution for this initiative is the Crop Science Department, Makerere University, Kampala.

Many of the international programmes such as the Global Taxonomy Initiative are not known by relevant stakeholders in Uganda due to poor communication between the CBD Focal Pont and the stakeholders. Issues of the GTI should be addressed as soon as possible. Uganda was represented at a GTI Africa Regional Workshop in Kirstenbosch, South Africa in early 2001 and the issues discussed at the workshop were very new to the participant.

Further comments on implementation of these decisions and the associated programme of work

Through the East African Community, there are plans to have approaches such as the ecosystem approach adopted. Through regional projects such as the UNDP-GEF Cross-border biodiversity project encompassing Kenya, Tanzania and Uganda, the ecosystem concept is being piloted.

Implementation of the Lake Victoria Management Project is now in its fourth year, and solid progress has been made within all the ten components of the project. The components include Fisheries management, Fisheries research, Water Hyacinth control, water quality and quantity monitoring, industrial and municipal waste management, land use management, catchment afforestation, wetlands management and support for human capacity building all coordinated by the National Secretariat of the Project. All the components have been able to locate and quantify some of the environmental problems arising from the increasing human activities around the shores of the lake. This is an effort to build up baseline information. Inventory and characteristics of the sources of pollution and nutrient inflows into the lake are being compiled with a view to implementing solutions. Efforts are being made throughout the project to involve local communities, NGOs and CBOs in order to ensure the ownership of the project activities.
