



BioBlitz 2013

To highlight the importance of biodiversity – also in the city, The National History Museum of Denmark will on the 17th of May perform a BioBlitz. The purpose of the BioBlitz is to map the biodiversity of a specific area within 24 hours by collecting, studying and validating as many different species as possible. Scientists from different fields of study at the museum (botany, entomology, mammals, birds, algae, fish, reptiles, amphibians etc.) will in collaboration with school kids and citizens of Copenhagen map the biodiversity of a green park in the heart of the city. The event will be joined by different activities all with the aim of disseminating knowledge, answering questions and to debate why it is important to maintain biodiversity.
